



HLTAID005 Provide first aid in remote situations - for teachers

Remote Area First Aid is tailored for teachers taking students on camps or excursions to remote or wilderness areas where medical support is more than one hour away.

The **HLTAID003 Provide first aid** qualification does not adequately prepare staff with the skills to fulfill their duty of care to students where medical support is not readily available.

Remote Area First Aid bridges this knowledge and skills gap, providing participants with a first aid response necessary to adequately care for someone ill or injured in an isolated environment.

Upon successful completion a Statement of Attainment in HLTAID005 Provide first aid in a remote situation is issued.

Training options

2 days face-to-face + study time

- Detailed hardcopy remote area first aid manual
- CPR wallet card
- Delivered by experienced paramedics, trained specifically in remote area casualty care
- Sound balance between theory and practical skills

Assessment

- Prepare a contingency plan for providing a first aid response in a remote situation
- Demonstrate competent CPR on an adult and infant manikin
- Respond to at least three simulated remote emergency scenarios
- Apply first aid procedures for a variety of first aid conditions, including prolonged casualty care, communication systems, environmental considerations and evacuation and transportation
- Complete a written knowledge assessment

Location

- Course is taught away from the classroom environment, in a realistic remote area setting
