



Remote Area First Aid

Remote Area First Aid is tailored for professional organisations or individuals who travel to remote or wilderness areas where medical support is more than one hour away.

The **HLTAID003 Provide first aid** qualification does not prepare participants with adequate skills to respond appropriately when a casualty may need to be managed for an extended period of time.

This course prepares the first aider with skills to manage a casualty where more extended periods of care may be required.

Remote Area First Aid bridges this knowledge and skills gap, providing participants with a first aid response necessary to adequately care for someone ill or injured in an isolated environment.

Upon successful completion a Statement of Attainment in HLTAID005 Provide first aid in remote situations is issued.

Course designed for

- Workers who undertake tasks in a remote environment
- Emergency services personnel
- Bushwalkers and hikers
- 4 wheel drive enthusiasts
- Professional recreational organisations responsible for taking individuals or groups to remote or wilderness areas
- Off-road biking
- Canoeists and rafters

Training options

2 days face-to-face + study time

- Detailed hardcopy remote area first aid manual
- CPR wallet card
- Delivered by paramedics, trained specifically in remote area casualty care
- Sound balance between theory and practical skills, including prolonged casualty care, communication systems, environmental considerations and evacuation and transportation

Assessment

- Prepare a contingency plan for providing a first aid response in a remote situation
- Demonstrate competent CPR on an adult and infant manikin
- Respond to at least three simulated remote area emergency scenarios
- Apply first aid procedures for a variety of first aid conditions
- Complete a written knowledge assessment

Location

- Program is delivered away from the workplace environment in a realistic remote area setting
